From the UACOA Executive Director

HELLO!

Welcome 2024!

While we are still working on wrapping up the final details from 2023, we thought that you'd like to know some of what we accomplished:

- UACOA messaging and branding refresh from our logo to our website to the words we use;
- Resource Directory (RD) was produced and sent to all of the 14,500+ households in UA with an additional 1,500 printed for distribution. The investment for last RD was \$11,000, for 2023 it was \$20,439. Of the 29 advertisers in the 2023, only 8 were in the previous edition. Nearly \$22,000 of advertising was sold
- Increased engagement by UAHS students: over the summer, nearly every request for assistance with weeding and yard help was met! Discussions are taking place around the creation of a "Student Seat" to the UACOA board. Several UAHS students are now UAV volunteers as well.
- Increased ed events: The UACOA hosted 7 education events in 2023. In 2022, the "This is Medicare" event had 4 people (according to the trainer). For 2023, we had 42. We will hold more in 2024!
- Increase in the number of seniors served. Through the end of 3Q23, more than 451 seniors from 19 zip codes were served (more than 395 from 43212/20/21). In 2022, through the 3rd quarter, that number was 272. These numbers represent only those for which we have an individual's name and contact information. We have touched many more than those listed here.

Our Board will be having a strategic planning retreat in February. We are excited to have this

time to focus on the future of the UACOA and how we can continue to grow our outreach and impact on the lives of UA's older residents and their families.

UA CARES- Winter Safety Tips Focus: Carbon Monoxide

With the cold come new challenges and the use of different appliances and tools. Our heaters are cranking this time of year and thus it makes it that much more important to protect our most important presents from hazards... family and friends!

What is Carbon Monoxide? It is a tasteless, colorless and odorless gas that is made when fuels such as Gasoline, Kerosene, and charcoal are burned.

How can I protect my family(pets) and friends from Carbon Monoxide?

- -Maintain and have fireplaces and wood stoves cleaned and serviced when needed.
- -Gas appliances serviced and cleaned appropriately.
- Running our gas engines in open air not in basements and small garages.
- -Warming our cars up outside and not inside, even if the garage door is open.
- -Make sure you have Carbon Monoxide detectors within date and functioning properly. Outside sleeping areas and one on each level of your home.

Please have a safe Winter and recognize the symptoms of Carbon Monoxide poisoning. C.O. Poisoning symptoms: Headache, nausea, dizziness, weakness, confusion, anxiety/ depression, disorientation, impaired vision. If you or a loved one is experiencing ongoing symptoms get out in fresh air and call 911.





City of UA Information on Electric Aggregation

By now you've heard about the City Council's September 25, 2023 approval to move forward with the electric aggregation proposal.

Following City Council adoption, SOPEC and the City have reviewed market rates and terms from AEP Energy bids and locked in pricing starting in January of 2024 through June of 2025. The three options for eligible households and businesses are:

- Default 100% Renewable Energy at 7.203 cents per kWh.
- Brown Energy step down priced at 6.823 cents per kWh.
- Opt out of the program altogether.

As a reminder, the AEP Ohio standard service offer rate is currently 10.910 cents per kWh.

Households and businesses that are eligible to participate in the program received a joint notice from SOPEC and the City towards the end of November, detailing the terms of the program. If they did not wish to participate, these prospective customers had 21 days to opt out of the program; there is also an option to leave the program any time for free.

KNOX BOX

Knox Box is a mini, lockable steel vault that provides firefighters and paramedics access to keys for entry to a residence or business in an emergency. Only the UA Fire Division can access boxes in Upper Arlington. The vault is installed by the resident on the structure's exterior near the entry. In an emergency, the dispatcher tells first responders if a Knox Box is onsite for easy building access, without forcing a door or damaging the building


